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CHALLENGE

The rate of urbanisation on the African continent is currently the highest in the world. It is anticipated that the urban population will double, from 229 to 525 million, between 1996 and 2020. The challenges are formidable: increasing poverty, inadequate shelter and urban services, and the degradation of the environment and the natural resource base as well as natural disasters and increasing civil strife. Many of the national and local institutions in Africa and the Arab States are ill equipped to meet the challenges of rapid urbanisation. In some African cities 50-70 % of residents live in informal settlements.

OUR GOAL

ROAAS provides advisory services and implements human settlements projects or programmes at the request of Member States. In doing so, ROAAS focus on strengthening in-country capacity to achieve:

"Sustainable urban development"*

as part of the implementation of the Habitat Agenda. The Regional Office helps to build knowledge through exchange of experiences to make cities and towns healthy, safe, equitable and sustainable.

APPROACH

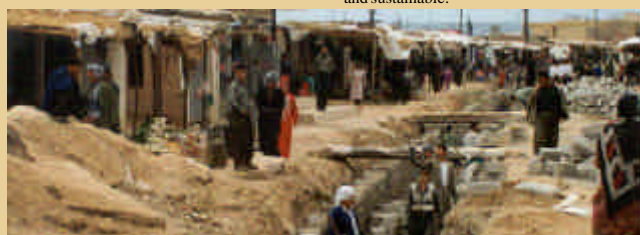
ROAAS's approach is to develop institutional capacity in Africa and the Arab States through advocacy, fostering and expanding partnership, institutional development and training and demonstration of operational activities. The office implements sustainable social, economic and environmental urban development, shelter and community projects and programmes funded by governments, bilateral and multilateral donors. ROAAS facilitates a process of urban development and management through updated sustainable methodologies. The office provides advisory services and project identification and formulation in the region at the request of interested Governments and local authorities. The Office is present in more than 35 countries, the majority of which are from Least Developed Countries LDC.

STRATEGIES

ROAAS's strategies focus on the Centre's new priorities. These consist of undertaking normative activities at the regional, national and local level through providing substantive input and mobilising additional resources, while continuing to develop operational activities. ROAAS builds into its project development adequate resources and time for information management including documentation, evaluation of lessons learnt and dissemination.

PARTNERS

Within the Centre, ROAAS involves global and regional programmes including: the inter-regional advisors in technical co-operation programme design, the Risk and Disaster Management Unit (RDMU), the Sustainable Cities Programme (SCP), the Global Urban Observatory (GUO), the Urban Management Programme (UMP), the Safer Cities Programme and the Managing Water for African Cities Programme. ROAAS's external partners include: Local and National Governments, UNDP, UNEP, European Commission, World Bank under the framework of the Cities Alliances and other international, national, and regional organisations.

The mission of ROAAS is to promote the **Habitat Agenda** at the regional level through supporting preparation of Istanbul +5 and the implementation of the two global campaigns on Secure Tenure and Urban Governance. ROAAS provides country and city partners with policy options, technical expertise, information management and project implementation capabilities. ROAAS contributes to the strengthening of the normative capacity of the Centre and its visibility at the regional level. Social, cultural and gender issues are carefully considered in all ROAAS projects.

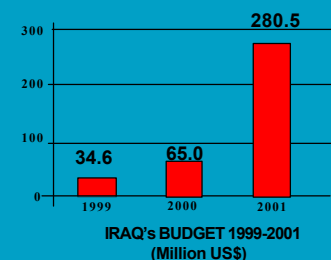
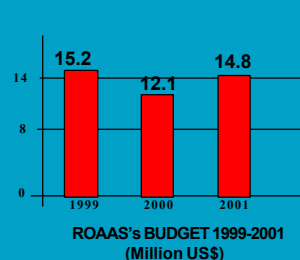
OPERATIONAL ACTIVITIES

The drastic reduction of funding available to United Nations agencies has highlighted the need to identify alternative sources including multi- and bi-lateral and national funding. ROAAS has consolidated its current portfolio of 66 ongoing projects and 31 pipeline projects including Support for Technical Services (STS) and Support for Policy and Programme Development projects (SPPD).

"Adequate Shelter for All" activities include 35 ongoing and 11 pipeline projects.

"Sustainable Urban Development" activities on the other hand include 31 ongoing and 19 pipeline projects.

New activities have been initiated at the city and national level, in line with the new work programme of UNCHS (Habitat), including monitoring and evaluation of programmes.



"ADEQUATE SHELTER FOR ALL"

Shelter and Housing

Support the formulation of National Housing Policies and the Preparation of Housing Programmes;

Improve access to adequate shelter by securing tenure;

Facilitate housing processes including the improvement of access to land, housing finance and technology;

Strengthen the construction sector through the promotion of energy efficiency;

Build local capacities in self-help and community construction techniques;

Promote housing conservation as well as restoration in traditional city cores rehabilitation and reconstruction of housing stock.

Community Services

Build local capacities to provide, manage and maintain community services effectively, and improve access by the poor to basic services (water supply, waste management systems, education and health facilities etc.);

Develop skills and awareness which enable communities to identify their own problems and priorities, and seek appropriate solutions.

Disaster Management

Enhance peace through reconstruction, rehabilitation and development;

Reintegrate returnees and accommodate internally displaced persons through a comprehensive planning approach.

Secure Tenure

The two Global Campaigns on "Secure Tenure" and "Urban Governance" are the corner stones of UNCHS (Habitat)'s Work Programme. ROAAS contributes to the implementation of both campaigns through follow-up in countries with ongoing projects and programmes. This support is in the form of inclusion of the campaigns' themes in the city/country projects or programmes, as well as working towards reinforcing the global norms and principles for secure tenure and good urban governance.

ROAAS's main contribution to the Secure Tenure Campaign is through in-country and city projects and programmes at national and local level. These are utilised as vehicles to advance the campaign issues as well as draw principles and lessons from the field to help and customise the campaign strategy in the region. The Office provides substantive inputs to the implementation of the campaign through workshops and meetings. Specific activities are being developed in post-conflict countries of Angola, Mozambique and Rwanda

Urban Governance

ROAAS promotes the Urban Governance campaign through workshops and meetings at the regional, national and local level, to initiate debate on concepts and norms relevant to Urban Governance and to outline a regional action plan. ROAAS addresses the campaign at the local level through demonstration process, institutional setup, indicators and identification of good practices and documentation of lessons learnt. The Office is instrumental in launching the campaign in several African and Arab countries.

Istanbul+5

ROAAS provides support to the preparation of the Istanbul+5 conference through the involvement of all field staff and assists national and local authorities to prepare and submit reports to the Preparatory Committee for Istanbul+5. During its in-country missions, ROAAS's staffs disseminate information about the Istanbul+5 preparatory process.

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
